He was predeceased by his parents, Ronald and Lila Bale; as well as several aunts, uncles, and cousins, who welcomed him with open arms. In his final years, Darcy found joy and purpose as the Maintenance Caretaker and resident "Mr. Fix-it" at Iver Main Retirement Home in Central Butte, SK. His time there was particularly special as he reconnected with family and long-time friends, bringing laughter and light to those around him.

Darcy had a passion for woodworking and ancestry research, dedicating his spare time to creating beautiful pieces of furniture for his nieces, which will be treasured by their families for generations to come. His creativity and craftsmanship were a testament to his love and thoughtfulness.
