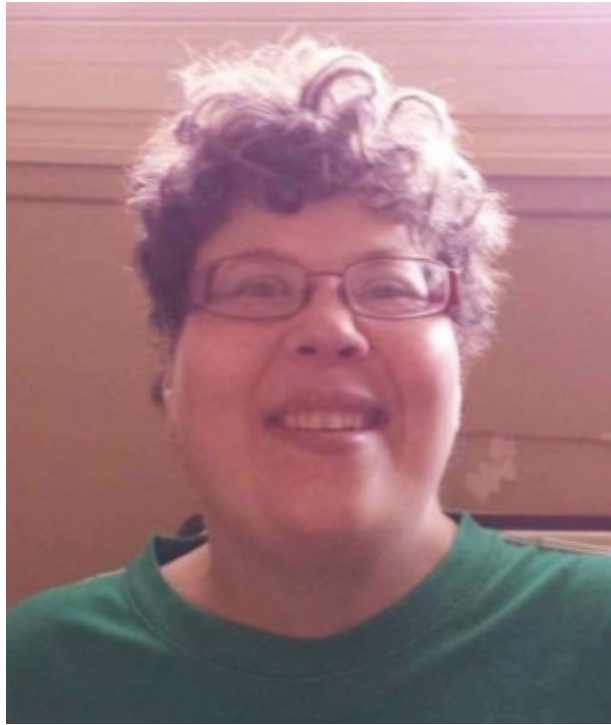


Berg, Cherilynn Agnes
