He was very community minded and loved to keep busy with gardening, hunting and fishing with friends and family, and helping with and following his sons' hockey teams. He spent many enjoyable hours with friends, neighbours and relatives, welding, fixing or repairing machinery. He remained actively farming until the age of 85. His grandkids and great-grandkids always brought a twinkle to his eye. His pranks and teasing would always put a smile on their faces. He loved to wind them up and then send them home. Cliff moved to Iver Main in 2011, and then to Regency Manor in 2015. We are very grateful for the wonderful care that he received from the Iver Main staff and Regency Manor staff.
