Kathleen Lorraine Brawdy was born on March 23rd, 1934 to Ella and John Weins. She was the second eldest of four sisters. Her adventures took her many places, but it was at Kedleston Church Camp where she met the love of her life, Ken, and they were married on November 28th, 1953.

Together, Kathy and Ken in Moose Jaw, SK, welcomed their first-born daughter, Karen, followed by their son, Mark, into their lives to complete their loving family. With Ken's job, they were transferred around the prairies beginning with Westlock,

AB, then to Thompson, MB, and finally to Winnipeg, MB. It was in Winnipeg where they spent the first part of their retirement years on their meticulously groomed acreage and shared treasured moments with Mark and his family.
