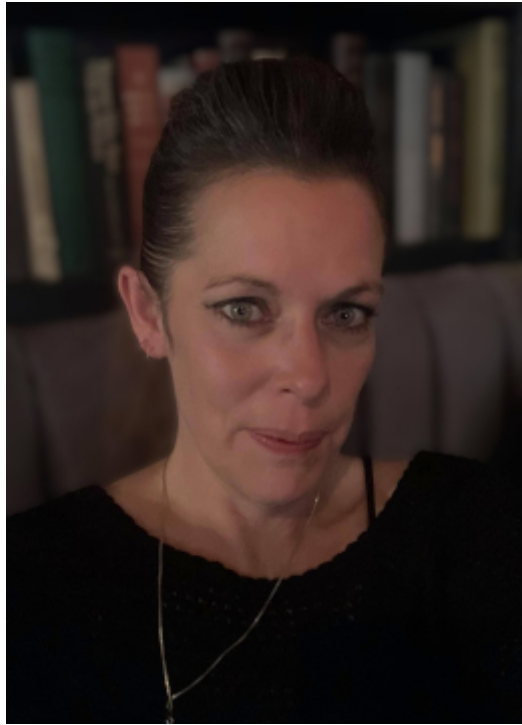


Chell, Jody
