She always made sure their tummies were full and their fingers were warm. Carol lived her time at Prince Arthur with passion and purpose.

In addition to work Carol also served faithfully as Chairman of the Moose Jaw Christian Women's Club, was actively involved in the ministry at Strasbourg Bible Camp, and served faithfully alongside her husband ministering both at Stadacona Gospel Chapel and as they travelled, as guest speaker at many bible camps across Saskatchewan, Alberta, and B.C.

Though work and service filled many hours of her days, absolutely nothing compared to the pride she had for her family. They were her life and undoubtedly there was never a conversation in which she wasn't boasting about one of them.
