## Tom Findlay

It is with deep sadness that the family of **Tom Findlay**, announce his passing, on Thursday, October 13th, 2022 at the age of 73 years. He was predeceased by his parents, Allen and Edna Findlay. Tom had also been a pilot and loved flying with family and friends to different places in Canada and the States. He was always up for an adventure. Most of all, Tom was looking forward to watching his grandchildren grow. He cherished every moment he had with them, including sliding down the slide at the playground with them.

Tom was taken by a fast and aggressive cancer. Even in facing that, he showed his great love for his family and immense gratitude for the life he had enjoyed.
