William Gardner of Moose Jaw, SK. passed away peacefully at Moose Jaw Union Hospital on December 20th, 2010 at the age of 88, after spending the day with many family members. He is survived by his wife, Marguerite; his son, Jim (Elaine) Gardner and granddaughters Emma and Kerry of Moose Jaw, and daughter Michele (Ken) Frick and grandsons Gregory and Matthew of Lethbridge, AB.
