She loved going to Bingo with her sisters Ruth and Bonnie. She was a proud member of the Eagles Ladies Auxiliary for many years. We as a family helped her celebrate the big milestones in her life, such as her 65th, 75th, 80th, 85th and 90th birthdays, having come and go teas or big parties for which she really enjoyed.
