She had her own quilting room that took over the entire basement of the house, with the pool table being the best place to lay out material to cut and piece together. She even had a quilting group with a few very special ladies – Vi, Lorrie, and BJ.

Irene moved into an apartment in Moose Jaw and stayed there for a couple of years. Eventually she moved into the Mulberry Estates where she made some new friends and found some old friends from Mortlach.

She was predeceased by her parents, Eva and Harry; in-laws, Irene and Lewis; husband, Keith; brother, Ernie; sister-in-law, Florence; and brother-in-law, Arden.
