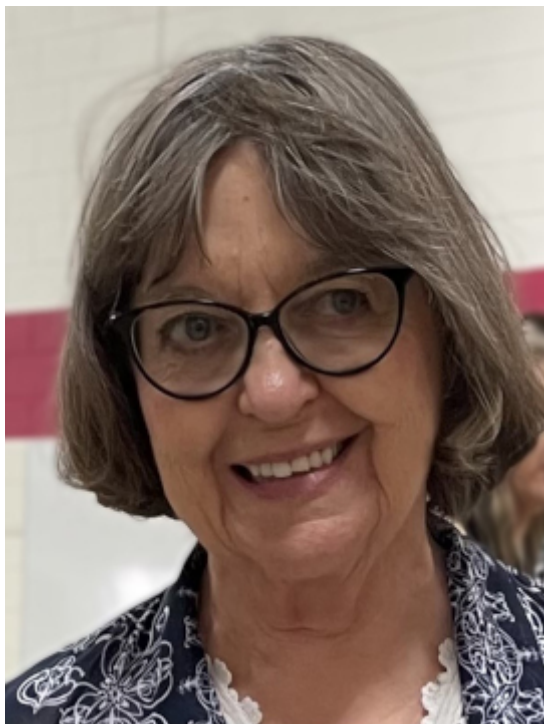


Hook, Joan Lorraine
