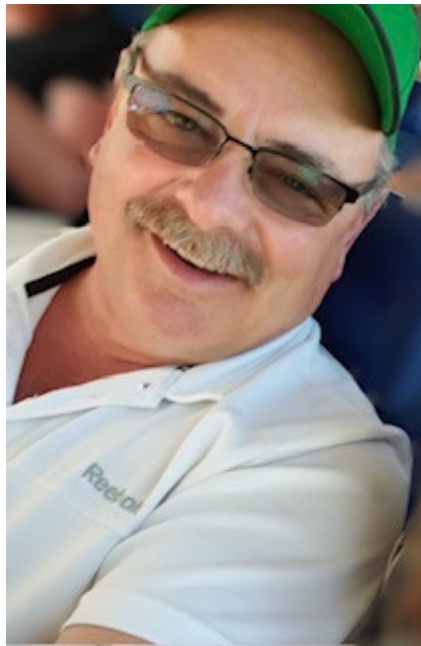


Lasota, Dale Lyndon
