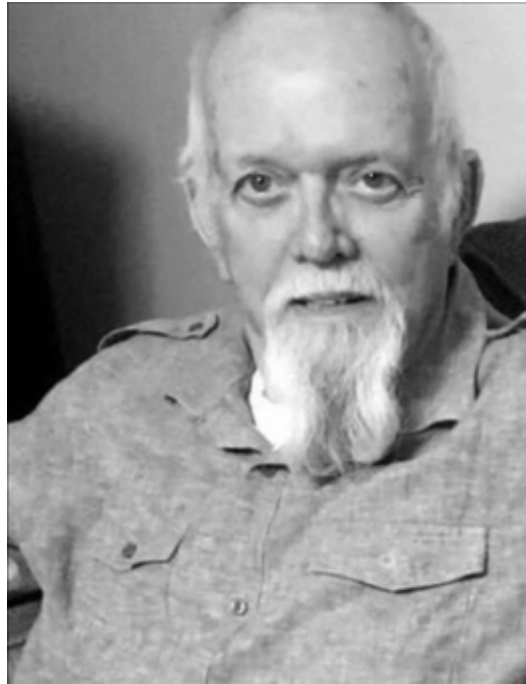


Lee, Gordon Paul
