After high school, he attended Normal School in Moose Jaw, SK and began his teaching career, receiving his B Ed and M Ed from the Universities of Saskatchewan and Alberta. He was wed with Rae in 1957 and settled in Moose Jaw. Gordon taught French at Central Collegiate until his retirement in 1988.

Gordon was predeceased by his wife, Rae (2020) and is survived by his sons, Bruce (Dawna) of Richmond, BC and Stuart (Liliana) of Weston, FL; and daughter, Lee of Vancouver, BC.
