John Roderick Doyle McMorris, born April 13th, 1951, sadly passed away on Saturday, May 11, 2024, after having lived with cancer for 15 years. John was one of a kind and during his 73 years, he lived a full life, and he lived it his way.

John grew up on the family farm six miles north of Lewvan, SK. He became an avid sports enthusiast, both in participating and observing. If you asked him what he did for a living he would say he was a farmer, which he was, but he also wore a few different hats. John managed several grain elevators in Saskatchewan, then moved on to designing and installing grain dryers in Saskatchewan, Mexico, and Ukraine for Grainhandler USA. He then began helping design, build, and commission concrete grain terminals in Saskatchewan, Alberta, Manitoba,

Ontario, and Kazakhstan for F.W.S Construction.

He was predeceased by his father, Gordon; mother, Thelma; sister, Lorna; and brother-in-law, Laurie; as well as Eleanor, the mother of his children.
