He was passionate about providing community supports for people with intellectual disabilities. Larry was well known and respected throughout the province as an advocate for people with disabilities, and was happy he was able to see the closure of Valley View Centre

during his lifetime so that the individuals could live a full life in their community. Larry worked in Human Services for over 30 years and retired as the Executive Director of Community Living Division. Another passion of his was woodworking, where he was able to create beautiful pieces of art. Many people have been fortunate to receive a piece of his work. After retirement, Larry was still involved with different agencies that support people with intellectual disabilities and most recently joined the Board of Directors at Diversified Services. **A Private Family interment will take place at Moose Jaw Funeral Home Columbarium with a Memorial Service to be announced at a later date.**
