Her family was her life.

While living at the lake she enjoyed watching various home-renovation shows which gave her alot of ideas on changing the color of her rooms, but instead of just changing the paint color she had Al add a basement and 500 square feet onto the house. She never did try to make anything easy. She always said, "It will only take but a minute". It took more than a minute but eventually she had the house of her dreams overlooking the lake and her many flower gardens.

Sandy worked at various businesses in Moose Jaw but didn't find her true calling until she began working at Walmart in 2000. She loved working with everyone there and made many great friends who she enjoyed having coffee and playing poker with. Sandy loved spending time with her children and grandchildren. She would take them on trips to the pool and down to the lake, playing games and just watching them having fun outside. Watching all 8 of her grandkids grow up was everything to her.

After finding out she had cancer in November of last year, things got very tough, but she never gave up. She tried to spend as much time with her family and friends as possible.
