It is with heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Carolle Aldene Moore after a short, courageous battle with cancer. With her family by her side, Carolle passed away on Thursday, June 25th, 2020 at the age of 82 years.

She was predeceased by her husband, Ray in 2010; parents, Clarence and Alma Sunde; and 9 siblings. She was a big time animal lover and was very happy with a dog or cat on her lap or by her side.

Even knowing that her time was coming to an end, Carolle never complained. She was always courteous, polite and friendly to her care givers right down to her last day. She was more concerned about her children than she was about herself. She was tired and just wanted to go see Dad. We all gave her our blessing and she has been reunited with Ray.
