He had a lifelong passion for music and the "Tunes" were always on in the vehicle, house or in the backyard while "Soaking up the Rays!" He loved his gardening and the time and care he put into his flower bed never went unnoticed. Dad and Mom were well known in Moose Jaw for their walks. Even before Dad's passing, they would be seen walking for miles. They loved to walk to the A&W for coffee with their friends. Ray was a great husband, father, grandfather, uncle, brother and friend. Ray was predeceased by his parents W.J. and Elizabeth Moore; sisters Eileen and Betty; and brothers James, Bill, Douglas, Myron, Melville and Ken.
