It is with the heaviest of hearts that we announce the sudden passing of **Donald A. Nicks**, aged 69 years of Moose Jaw, SK on Thursday, March 31st, 2022.

Don was born in Summerside, P.E.I. but moved about frequently during his youth. Being the son of an RCAF pilot, this was very common. Though he was born in Summerside, he considered Burnaby, BC his true hometown.

Don had a long and satisfying career in the Armed Forces. Initially, he began this with a stint in the army serving with The Royal Westminster Regiment. After a time, he decided to follow in his father's footsteps and went into the air force. It was here where he truly hit his stride. Thirty six years of duty, all over this country and into others, Don developed a reputation and a legacy. He was always that person who could bring forth the most interesting pieces of trivia and he possessed a veritable encyclopedia of knowledge on a wide

variety of subjects.
