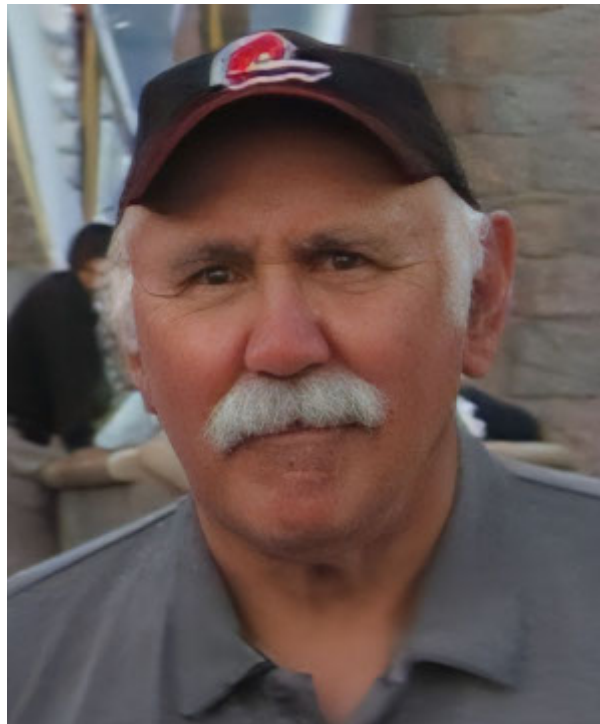


Phillips, Richard “Wayne”
