Dorothy loved to bake for everyone. The lucky recipients were the truckers and workers at the potato operation, many neighbours and friends and buns for everyone at the Fowl Suppers. Dorothy had a heart of gold, a friend to many, and always wanted to Welcome and help people, wherever she could. Dorothy was predeceased by her husband of 63 years, Mel, two children, Lois and Ross.
