Mark was born on September 27th, 1946, in Moose Jaw, SK to Dot and Bill Sagal. He grew up in the community of Marquis, SK and was the oldest of four children. In Calgary, AB Mark was a Rail Traffic Control Manager at the Network Management Centre. Following this, in Vancouver, BC he worked as a Crisis Manager Consultant, working for BC Rail. After retiring from CP Rail, Mark became a railway consultant – rules, training and certification for Omnitrails, a short line railway, and then with Hudson Bay Rail. Mark loved his work and put his whole heart into doing his job well.

Mark was an avid hunter, fisherman and camper. He loved the outdoors. He loved hunting big game, as well as goose hunting, and spent countless hours with his buddies and Nancy out in the hills looking for the “big one”. Mark and Nancy loved hunting and camping together and spent many happy times at Rowan’s Ravine, a favourite camping spot.
