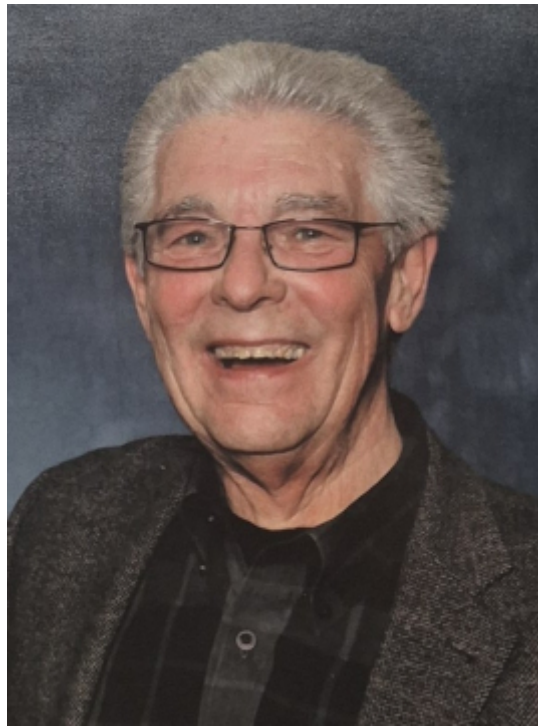


Sills, Arthur Thomas
