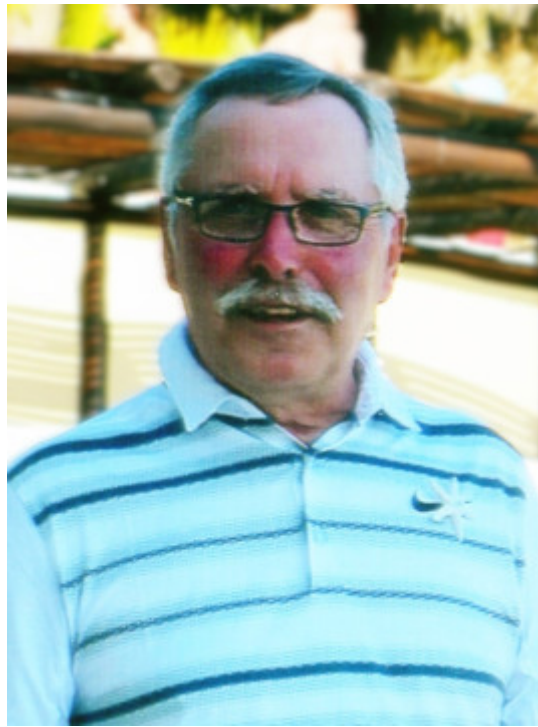


Spicer, Brent Kendall
