He was a long-time sports enthusiast, playing hockey and baseball and curling in various leagues. He later coached minor girls' fastball, enjoyed taking in hockey games and spent many hours watching curling, hockey and football on television. Roscoe was an enthusiastic and active member of the Royal Canadian Legion, serving on numerous committees, working his way through various executive positions and serving two years as President, the first associate member to ever hold that position with Branch No. 59. For his efforts he received various certificates of appreciation, and most recently received his life membership pin, Meritorious Service Medal and the Saskatchewan Centennial Medal. He also served as Zone and District commander and spent many enjoyable hours travelling to the various branches under his command. Roscoe was also involved in other community organizations. Despite his diagnosis and treatment for cancer, his spirits were upbeat and he was thankful for the ability to carry on with the volunteer work he loved.
