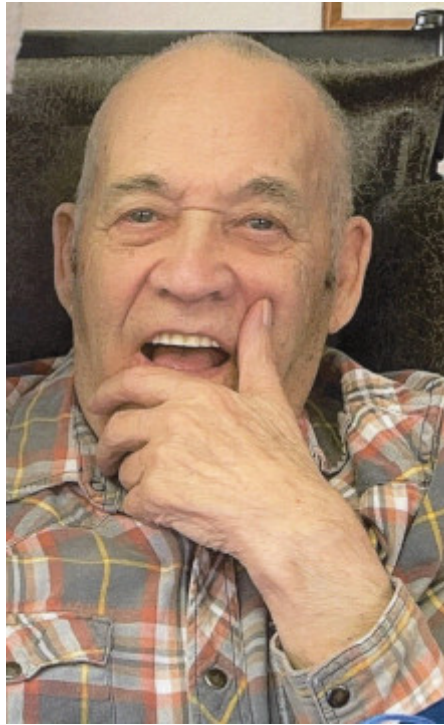


Swanson, Melvin Sander
