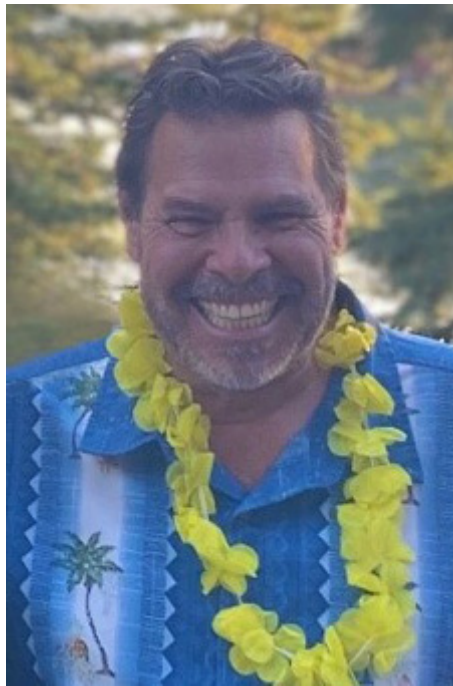


Temple, Curtis Dean
