Mom and Dad enjoyed many winters in Arizona with their friends. Dad enjoyed all the fishing trips he took with family and many good friends. He loved to golf and curl, which he was doing up until his passing. He enjoyed every opportunity he got to spend with his family and grandchildren. He loved to tell stories about his life experiences and always had an ear to listen to what you had to say. Dad had a strong belief and faith of the church, which was very important to him and he tried to instill this in his family.
