On Wednesday, October 1st, 2025, just eight months after her 100th birthday, Phyllis Walrath slipped away to Glory in her sleep at Providence Place in Moose Jaw, SK. She was predeceased by her parents, Alice and Garrow Langman; husband, Jack in 2010; and 2 older sisters and brothers-in-law, Ruth (Lloyd Cornish) and Delia (Bud Rodine, Gerald Alexander). Gathered in for her birthday celebration on Boxing Day were her two daughters, Brenda (Randy) Babich and Bonnie (Gord) Hallett; and all her 5 grandchildren, their spouses, and 13 great-grandchildren. Also present to celebrate Phyllis were numerous friends from the Free Methodist Churches in the area, and friends and caregivers from her 18 years at the Bentley.

Phyllis grew up near Weyburn, SK in the Goodwater district, attending Ingleford and Delight schools. She graduated from

They also spent many years working for the Arlington Beach Camp and Conference Centre on Last Mountain Lake.
