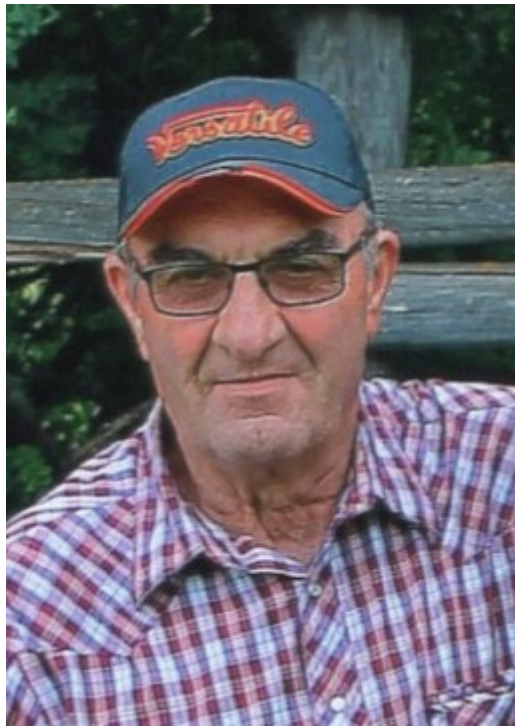


Wilson, Thomas Gerald
